quality education.


Students enjoy the informal, friendly atmosphere that emphasises a mature and independent approach to their studies.



A-Leve

Students join the College because they are attracted by our small class sizes, excellent teaching and more informal setting. They benefit from our friendly, supportive and individually tailored educational environment.

Students can choose from a wide range of A-levels and there are no constraints on the combination of subjects which may be taken.



Two Year A-Level Courses

Our two year A-level courses are suited to students who have completed their GCSEs at the College or elsewhere. Courses are also suitable for students who have had some experience of A-level studies but wish to restart a full two year A-level programme.

Two year programmes allow students the opportunity to explore a subject in depth and the time to consolidate their ideas. It can also give students, fresh from completing GCSEs, the time to develop and enhance their academic skills.



One Year A-Level Courses

Our one year courses allow students to cover an entire A-Level specification in a single academic year. As a result, courses are intensive and highly structured. They are suited to students who have experience of studying at A-level and wish to make a fresh start, or to take a new subject.

Experienced teachers provide support and guidance to help students cope with the faster pace of study and in particular to help students develop the learning skills and exam techniques necessary to perform well.







Careers & University Entrance

The College has an excellent reputation for helping students to gain places at high-ranking Universities and onto competitive courses.

A ten-week UCAS
Programme is integral to
the A-level curriculum for
Year 13 students who are
looking to make a University
application. This helps them
to choose a degree course,
make decisions about

where they wish to apply and provides guidance with regard to funding, accommodation, and completing their Personal Statement.

The College also provides assistance to students who may wish to apply for an apprenticeship or gain work-shadowing experience.


